Letter from our Youth Leadership Team

Dear PeaceJam Community

We are so excited to share with you our 2025 - 2026 Impact Report. Celebrating 20 years of PeaceJam UK. This document is a snapshot of the last academic year, and although we have tried our best to capture the positive change within ourselves and our communities, there is so much more we wish we could have added to these pages.

PeaceJam UK is made up of a small team, all part-time, that delivers programmes and projects to a large geographic footprint. Therefore, when we share that in our first full year of delivering the 'Be the Change!' project we reached 915 students across seven different schools, that contributed to, approximately 2200 miles that our Youth Leadership Team Chair and PeaceJam UK Coordinator, Fay, travelled by train and lifts from volunteers in September and October 2025 alone.

This last academic year has seen our largest Youth Leadership Team cohort yet, with 23 of us committed to taking positive action. This report may not include the full extent to which our team can recite "Hamilton" lyrics during our Training Weekend or the enthusiasm in which members have stayed up creating PeaceJam stickers for a Peace Picnic with greaseproof paper, clear tape, 100 PeaceJam UK logos and a pair of scissors. However we hope it showcases the friendships we have made and the community we have built. Also, this report does not fully capture the impact of the teachers and youth workers, who have advocated for our work, and of course fuelled the PeaceJam UK team with school lunches and cups of tea when we visit. Nor the countless volunteers and community partners across the UK that have made our work possible. Especially our Rotary volunteers - Robin Graham who has spearheaded our thriving Manchester hub, and Carol Jordan and Richard Burnett who have championed PeaceJam in their districts. This support has included many emails, countless lifts, hosting our staff and, in Richard's case, making enough food to feed a small village for our Romsey Slam.

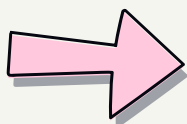

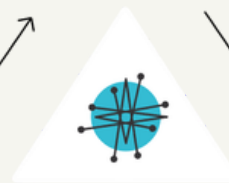
The PeaceJam UK programme consists of three components: Education, Inspiration and

Resources

PeaceJam UK has been working with schools and youth groups since 2006 through its education programmes and teacher-friendly resources.

Each lesson plan has been carefully mapped to show how it meets UK educational standards, with different learning outcomes by ability range in the class, and handy worksheets you can print out or photocopy. They can be used in core lessons (such as RE, Citizenship, PSHE or History), or in lunchtime and after-school clubs, or drop-down days.

We offer ongoing teacher and youth leader support on PeaceJam delivery, as well as online and in-person training on our resources and curricula.

'Be the Change!' and our workshops

'Be the Change!'



Empowering 10,000 youth to undertake positive change in themselves and in their communities.



Providing a solution to increasing community conflict and apathy, with youth leading the way to change the world.



Taking our near-peer mentors, young professionals and university students, directly to schools and youth groups to deliver workshops to youth aged 11-18 whilst providing mutual development opportunities.



Three 60-minute workshops over a school term or academic year with ongoing teacher/youth worker support to facilitate youth-led action.



'Be the Change!' launched in December 2024 and after **our first full academic year of delivery in 2025-2026**, approximately **915 students across seven different schools** engaged in our Project.

YORK

At Bootham School, York, in September 2025 PeaceJam launched 'Be the Change!' across Year 7 to Year 12, totalling 380 students. This included creating resources, such as video content and collaborative activities to start promoting discussions around peace and conflict.

Following this launch, students from across the school have been meeting on a Tuesday afternoon every week to develop social action projects. PeaceJam UK has continued to support these students across the academic year.

Likewise, in September 2025, at The Mount School, York, PeaceJam UK ran five initial 'Be the Change!' workshops across Year 7 to Year 11, totalling 90 students. Students discussed their concerns and worries, which included exam pressure, deforestation, animal rights, and many other local and global issues. Over the academic year, PeaceJam delivered workshops online and in person to support youth action.



Long Term Growth!

With the amazing support of our partner schools, not only are we aiming to grow 'Be the Change' in York and the surrounding areas for 2026 - 2027, but our local youth are also planning the very first York Slam.

'Be the Change!' and our workshops

MANCHESTER AND BOLTON

'Be the Change!' returned for a second year in Manchester and for the first year expanded to Bolton. Working with approximately 45 students aged 11-16 in January 2026, we launched 'Be the Change!' in Sharples School, Manchester Communication Academy (MCA) and Smithills School. Participants took part in follow up workshops in March to support students develop and implement their projects. Students also had the chance to present their projects at the Manchester Slam at the end of March.

HAVANT

In February and March we delivered kickstart workshops to Year 10 students at Warblington School, approximately 60 students, identifying local issues and identifying potential actions youth and local residents can take.

We offer one-off workshops or assemblies to kickstart student engagement in PeaceJam in schools and youth groups.

ROMSEY

PeaceJam UK delivered 10 face to face 'Be the Change!' kickoff workshops to approximately 300 Year 7 and 8 students at The Romsey School in the Summer Term. Resources and support were provided to staff members to deliver the workshop to additional classes. An assembly was given to over 200 Year 9 students. As a follow up, 40 students across Year 7 - 10 took part in social action planning workshops with students having the opportunity to present their projects at the first PeaceJam Romsey Slam.

'Be the Change!' Project Spotlight:

The MCA Year 11 PeaceJam Group, addressed homelessness. They partnered with local charities, created educational resources for lessons and planned an annual school fundraiser.

Our conferences and events



In 2025-2026, PeaceJam UK facilitated **one PeaceJam Online Conference** and **two PeaceJam Slams**. One-day events that have been designed by youth, for youth, bringing together inspirational speakers, action based workshops and near-peer mentoring groups.

“Being involved in putting this event together has pushed me to think more creatively, taught me how to collaborate, and speak up about issues that matter.”

PEACEJAM UK ONLINE CONFERENCE

In June 2025, PeaceJam UK advertised for and launched an Online Conference Youth Action Group of 14-18 year old students from across the UK, who partnered with our Youth Team to plan an Online Conference. They met weekly, developing their leadership, communication and event management skills to plan and host the conference. The Online Conference took place in November 2025 and the theme was 'How do we combat conflict?'.

“I have loved my experience as a member of PeaceJam Youth Action Group as we have worked towards this event. Everything about it from meeting up with other members from all around the country and collaborating with them, to having helped organise panels and workshops has been amazing.”

MANCHESTER SLAM

Our second Manchester Slam took place on Saturday 21 March. Participants took part in an action-packed day with two Q&A panels, hands-on workshops on issue areas such as knife crime and female genital mutilation, and included near-peer mentoring groups.

Our youth identified that while local issues saw an uptake in community action after an incident or crime, preventative action was lacking. This is why the students at Sharples School and MCA chose the theme as 'Stronger Together! Students at MCA also spearheaded a school-wide art competition based on the theme to increase engagement.

ROMSEY SLAM

Our Youth Leadership Team members took a leading role in our first ever Romsey Slam in June 2026. They joined the panel as participants and moderators, designed the family group plans (our small group near-peer mentoring sessions) with fun and reflective activities, and even ran a workshop.

After PeaceJam UK facilitated workshops across The Romsey School as part of our 'Be the Change!' Project, participating students discussed the issues they could see locally, nationally and globally. Witnessing increasing division and wanting to address the root cause, students discussed the importance of feeling safe and building positive connections. This is why the PeaceJam UK Youth Leadership chose the theme of The Romsey Slam as 'Creating Communities'!

BRADFORD PEACE PICNIC



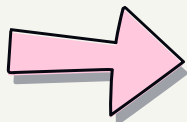
Organised by Matty, from the PeaceJam UK Youth Leadership Team, with Bradford Culture Company, 228 people joined PeaceJam UK in Bradford to mark Hiroshima Day. We set up in Wibsey Park to explore what peace means to us with a free family friendly event.

We had so many activities full of colour, crafts and care! You could add a message to our peace tree, help us decorate the peace symbol, learn about nuclear disarmament in our quiz, take part in a peace scavenger hunt, weave a peace pledge into our picnic blanket, chat all things peace, community and care with the People's Care Movement, make a placard for peace with amazing local artist Amy. It was such a meaningful day, working with local Bradford community members, with peace and community at the heart of all our activities.

Ensuring PeaceJam UK is for youth, by youth whilst providing mentoring and development opportunities for young leaders.

GOAL

1

We want everything we do at PeaceJam UK to be steered and led by our recipients: young people across the UK. For youth, by youth.



Meeting monthly online, the Youth Leadership Team works closely with the UK Leadership Team to help shape and run events, provide feedback on, and create initiatives.

GOAL

2

Today's youth is passionate about creating change but struggle without the necessary training, funds and experience to implement sustainable change.



A year-long mentorship for 14-25 year olds that provides online and in-person training, tailored social action project support, leadership roles, and networking opportunities with other UK changemakers. At the end of the year participants will have built a portfolio of work and receive a letter of reference for their next steps.



Since 2023, The Youth Leadership Team has run in this format with new applications every September. We have seen gradual growth with **2025 - 2026 being our biggest cohort yet with 23 participants.**

Additionally, 2025 - 2026 **returning participants gained additional experience** by mentoring newer members, reflecting the Youth Leadership Team commitment to continuous development opportunities.

In **2026-2027**, PeaceJam UK is aiming to develop **a follow-on alumni network of connected changemakers.**

BRADFORD Youth Team Training Weekend

From Friday 13 to Monday 16 February PeaceJam UK facilitated the very first Youth Leadership Weekend in Bradford. Thirteen members of the Youth Leadership Team, including a small number of PeaceJam youth ambassadors from our partner schools, travelled from across the UK for a three day programme of learning, creativity, and community building. It was spearheaded by Youth Team member, Matty, and PeaceJam UK Coordinator, Fay.

"I'm Matty and I've been on the PeaceJam Youth Leadership Team since 2023. My specific focuses within peace building are nuclear disarmament and youth empowerment. This year for my PeaceJam social action project I wanted to bring our Youth Team together in-person to learn new skills and create real connections which isn't always possible online, particularly as some of our members have an age difference of over 10 years.

I live in Bradford, a city with a deep history of grassroots community activism. I wanted our members to meet here to learn from the expertise and experiences of Bradford's activist scene. As part of the weekend, I invited local community members that I work with, and am inspired by, to run workshops with a focus on creativity to demonstrate that social action is about creating change through hope and care."



"Something that inspired me was how passionate everyone was about their social action projects and how invested everyone was in helping each other."

"At first I was quite scared about coming onto this programme because I am not good at meeting new people and public speaking (sharing my opinions). But every PeaceJammer was so welcoming and I feel like there is a safe space where I can be myself and share my thoughts."



Internships, volunteering and mentoring

We work to ensure there are multiple opportunities to engage in PeaceJam and further the development of future changemakers. For example, people of all ages can engage with the **One Billion Acts of Peace Project**.

Apart from our **Youth Leadership Team** and becoming a PeaceJam **mentor**, PeaceJam UK offers **academic year-long and summer internships**, for youth over the age of 16. Volunteering for us can count towards the different **Duke of Edinburgh Award tiers, enrichment and volunteering requirements for college/sixth form settings and volunteer modules for University Degrees**. We tailor internship and volunteering experience to what our youth are aiming to gain experience in and offer regular one to one mentoring and training to support development.



billion acts

Billion Acts:

On PeaceJam's 10 year anniversary, 10 Nobel Peace Laureates and 3000 PeaceJam youth from over 40 countries joined together to plan and implement a global call to action. 10 Issue Areas were identified as the most important of our time to ensure peace in the world, and a goal was set, to join together to create and inspire 1 Billion Acts of Peace

"I want to apply for this internship because I am interested in learning how events are planned and delivered, especially those that bring young people together in a positive way. I would like to gain real experience in event organisation, teamwork and communication. In the long term, I want to develop leadership and people skills that will help me in future roles."

Internships

Bootham School Social Media Internship: Three Year 12 Bootham School students applied and volunteered as social media interns every week for PeaceJam UK over the academic year 2025-2026. They received Social Media Training and developed skills they put to use as part of the 'Be the Change!' programme, when building and implementing their projects.

Summer Social Media Internship: A small group undertook an 8-week volunteer internship, working remotely to develop creative and strategic skills, build our social media platforms and newsletter, as well as highlighting our Nobel Laureates and sharing how other young people can take positive action.

Summer Event Management Internship: A small group undertook an 11-week volunteer internship to develop an online event for youth by youth to mark The International Day of Peace on 21 September.

The team have decided to organise a weekend programme under the theme 'Peace Starts With You'. Watch this space!

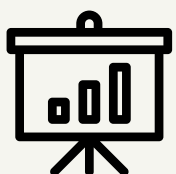
Our Rotary partnerships

ROTARY

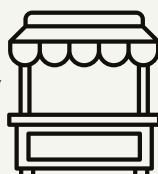


Rotary is a global network of more than 1.2 million neighbours, friends, community leaders, and problem solvers, who unite and take action to create lasting change, globally, locally, and in themselves.

Our work would not be possible without so many Rotary volunteers supporting our events, projects, and volunteering their time. Here are some of the ways we work with Rotary:



We speak about PeaceJam opportunities to local Rotary clubs across the UK and beyond! In September, we presented virtually to the **E-Club of South Africa One**, and we presented in person to **New Forest Rotary** in October and **Wareham Rotary** in March.



We can speak at, facilitate workshops or run stalls at District Assemblies and District Conferences. In October, we had stalls at Rotary District **1040's Conference in Scarborough**, and Rotary District **1110's Conference in Swindon**.



We work with **Rotaractors** (18–30-year-old youth) and **Rotary Peace Scholars** to train as mentors for our events and projects, as well as offering numerous internships and development opportunities to support participants in reaching their goals. This academic year, our **Online Conference and Slams** all featured **Rotaract or Peace Scholar** mentors.



We work with Interact (Secondary School) and RotaKids (Primary School) Clubs to deliver our tailored curricula, resources, and the 'Be the Change!' Project. We worked with the **Sharples School Interact group in Bolton** to facilitate 'Be the Change!'.

PeaceJam-RotaKids Club

For the academic year 2025-2026, PeaceJam UK partnered with Westbourne Rotary to host a joint PeaceJam-RotaKids Club at St Michael's School in Bournemouth for Key Stage 2 (Years 3 - 6) students. Every week students take action to improve their school environment while learning about local and global issues. The participants develop their empathy, communication and teamwork skills. Overall, forty pupils took part in the PeaceJam-RotaKids Club over the academic year and on the 3 July, they all received a certificate and an official Club hat at their very own celebration assembly. We are so excited to continue the Club next year and to keep supporting St Michael's to develop their inspiring peacemakers.

Southbourne Food and Fun Festival

A free one-day festival in May celebrating the Rotary areas of focus, connecting food and fun to good causes and community projects. PeaceJam UK ran an area dedicated to peace and youth, encouraging the public to create peace stones and add to our communi-tree!



We have featured twice on Hope FM, with PeaceJam Coordinator Fay on the airwaves on the Westbourne Rotary monthly radio slot.



Our advocacy work

Supporting Teachers and Youth Leaders

National Justice and Peace Network (NJPN) Conference:

In July 2026, PeaceJam UK took part in the NJPN Conference, 'JUST TALK' in Derby. The conference aimed to increase participants' understanding of how language and other forms of communication are used or misused in our current context, and to help participants challenge disinformation and divisive rhetoric, foster dialogue and encounter, and speak truth to power. PeaceJam UK ran a workshop discussing how to have 'difficult conversations', sharing resources and tips for other facilitators and peace advocates from across the UK. Fay, our PeaceJam UK Coordinator was a featured speaker, challenging participants to reframe narratives from a youth perspective.

From a Hidden Hero nomination:

PeaceJam UK Hidden Hero Award:

In December we once again hosted our Hidden Hero Awards, driven by our Peacejammers and mentors to recognise teachers and youth leaders that have gone above and beyond across the UK. All our nominees receive a certificate of recognition and are entered into our prize draw to win a £40 Marks and Spencers voucher.

Supporting Research on 'Supporting schools to teach controversial issues':

Across March to September 2025 PeaceJam UK took part in a research study conducted by the National Institute of Economic and Social Research on 'Supporting schools to teach controversial issues: Teacher Guidance for working with external organisations'. This included being interviewed and observed by the research team and networking with other charities across the UK to feedback and discuss how we can support teachers in today's current climate. The research was published in November.

WINCHESTER

Mayors for Peace Event

Winchester City Council's Mayoralty is part of Mayors for Peace, which each year marks the anniversary of the destruction of Hiroshima by an atomic bomb on 6 August 1945. PeaceJam UK gave a presentation alongside the University of Winchester, SWVG and Creative Voices for Peace. Members of the Winchester Ukrainian Cultural Association brought greetings with the event closing with a traditional Ukrainian folksong.

Traditionally, our PeaceJam mentors are near-peer young professionals and university students over the age of 18. However, after the Youth Leadership Team Training Weekend, the Team is working together to build a junior mentor track. They were inspired by the youth volunteers at CATCH Leeds, taking on responsibility for their community and peers. Our Peacejammers are creating the opportunity for 16-18-year-old Peacejammers to learn mentoring skills and engage in peer-to-peer support.

Our 2026 - 2027 strategic goals

With conflict filling our media streams and division seemingly on the rise, peace education, community growth, youth empowerment and positive action is the ever needed solution. We are so excited to keep developing our programmes, projects and resources with youth at the centre of everything we do.

Here are our four main strategic goals for 2026-2027:

Inspiration

Launching Rotary Youth Forums: For 2026-2027 we are launching a new opportunity for Rotary Clubs to connect directly with their local youth in a 90 minute workshop facilitated by PeaceJam UK. A space for young people to share their concerns and worries and turn them into action with PeaceJam resources and Rotary support. This is also an opportunity to connect participants to Rotary Youth Programmes, such as Youth Speaks, and hear more about the inspiring work Rotary undertakes in the local community and how they can get involved. A mutually inspirational and beneficial intergenerational community project!

Education

Building our Reading Passport Project: In 2025, children's enjoyment of reading was at a 20-year low of 32.7% in the UK. Our youth always positively engage with our Laureate stories so to take action we have worked to create our Reading Passport Project. Our 14 Nobel Laureate stories for KS2 students in easily accessible booklets that include a glossary, country flag piece, and illustrations from independent artists. Youth can read then reflect and plan action in a passport-style work book alongside their reading. We have been trialling the project in our PeaceJam-RotaKids Club in Bournemouth, utilising and improving on all youth feedback, and in 2026 - 2027 we aim to grow our trials and launch our full Project by summer 2027.

Action

Growing 'Be the Change': After our first successful full academic year, our goal is to increase the number of participating schools and the subsequent number of logged social action projects as part of the the Billion Acts campaign in 2026 - 2027.

Community

Creating a PeaceJam UK Alumni Group: In 2026-2027, PeaceJam UK is aiming to develop a community of connected changemakers, as a follow-on from our Youth Leadership Team and youth programmes. This will involve regular networking and further leadership role opportunities.
